What is an Inclusive Playground?

An inclusive playground has unique play equipment and is designed so kids of all abilities have the chance to play together – while giving parents an opportunity to relax, interact, and fortify friendships.

Where is it?

Old Meadows Park in Thousand Oaks has been the home of an award-winning Therapeutic Recreation program for more than 30 years. The current playground is aging and in need of upgrades and expansion.

What is Therapeutic Recreation?

Therapeutic Recreation serves kids and adults with both physical and cognitive special needs. The fastest growing segment of this population are kids on the autism spectrum. The goal of an inclusive playground is to have typical kids as well as the special needs population interact, play, and learn together in a safe and fun environment.

How much are you trying to raise?

The total cost of the new playground will be approximately \$500,000. To date, with the help of the Conejo Recreation and Park District, local Rotary Clubs, the County of Ventura, City of Thousand Oaks, and the Power Family, we have raised nearly \$200,000.

When are you going to move forward with this project?

We plan to complete Phase 1 of the project before the City of Thousand Oaks serves as a "Host City" for Special Olympic Athletes who will be competing in the Special Olympics World Games in Los Angeles in July 2015.
